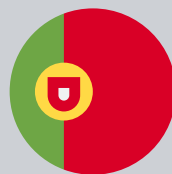

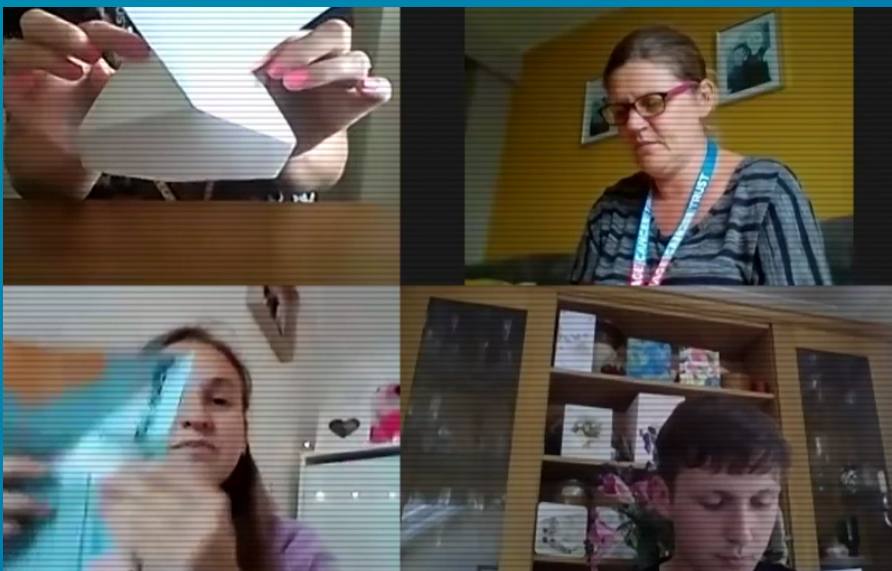

# HOW YOUR SUPPORT COULD HELP
